Rally Reports were received and Alice thanked all stewards for their reports and hard work.

A couple of things to consider for the future:

- Disabled parking area.
- Should we have car parking stewards for a few hours in the morning?
- Need more stewards on gate and on the signing in desk up to 10.30am.
- Trophies - should we consider a fine process - any trophy that is returned, late, unclean and not engraved by a certain date that there will be a £10 charge? If we agree on a change to this rule it has to be added to the rally day general rules.
- Need to have a bit more space between the flower competition tables and need to consider the rules when it states viewed from all sides when setting up the flower area.
- Consider that the Stars in their Eyes trophy is for in the future - winning club overall, highest individual or highest marked in either section.
- Should we have some anonymity when judges are judging various competitions?
- Need to ensure we have dedicated area for generation game.
- Can we review the stage competitions again. Can we have some competitions which are completed prior to Rally and others performed on Rally Day this will then give all clubs a chance to compete on Rally Day in the stage competitions. e.g. if we have 5 stage competitions we run three in their entirety on rally day and 2 pre rally - this will save judges having to give up a night and a day and also allows clubs to prepare better for Rally Day and consider the time table
- Timetable is agreed in Exec and should not be changed.

A discussion followed and it was agreed that the general rules should be amended to include the rule that ALL rally cups must be returned to the office by the 1st May or the Friday before if it falls on a weekend or bank holiday. Any late cups will incur a £10 fine and any cup not cleaned will also incur a £10 fine.

It was agreed to continue without car parking stewards but it was suggested that better signage would be helpful as well as more YFC Signage. It was suggested that this could be potentially a competition at the winter fair for members to make appropriate signs. It was also asked that the location of each competition be added to the programme so people knew where to go to watch various events.

1. 2017 County Rally:

2. 2016 Royal Welsh Show

There had been a problem with the woodwork results as the judges had given an extra mark to south Pems. The marks had been added accordingly but the place card had given them 1st position instead of 2nd. Hermon will therefore progress to the RWS. There was also a joint placing in stockjudging. Dill Williams county president drew Amy Wallace from Clunderwen to represent in the stockjudging. Letters had been circulated to all other teams inviting them to represent county at the RWS

3. 2016/2017 County Competitions Programme including Dates, Rules and Judges
Unfortunately, the wales Competitions Programme has not been released as yet so it was therefore impossible to plan the county calendar. Some dates are already in from previous meetings and it was agreed that last year's corresponding dates would be adopted this year as far as possible.

Katie also requested that names be submitted for possible Wales's judges as well as county judges. It was agreed to hold an extraordinary competitions meeting on the 30th August to agree judges for the other competitions and to discuss the competitions.

4. 2016 County Eisteddfod.

Eisteddfod judges are in hand and we are awaiting confirmation of the booking for Preseli. It was noted that perhaps contacting the school office.

5. E. R. Phillips Award.

A discussion was held on how to run the E.R.Phillips award at the County Show this year as it would be the only competition that would remain at the show. It was agreed that all entries would be received at the office one week prior to the show on the Monday and the result announced during the reception. It was agreed that an email be sent out informing clubs of the date for entries for the ER Phillips Award.

6. Recorder for Championship Trophy.

Mrs Mair Evans to be invited to act as recorder for championship trophy.

8. Any Other Business.

Wales Council - starting at 1pm

There will be no County Bus for the sports but Eirlys Davies requested that teams be allowed to hire the astro turf in Fishguard for training at a cost of £24.50. It was agreed. A cup had been donated to the county by Mrs Wendy Phillips to be presented to Angharad Edwards the best Chairman under 26 in the Welsh Public Speaking. County President Dill Williams made the presentation.

The report was adopted.

(C) County Show Working Party 8/06/16

Alice James in moving for the adoption of a written report informed the meeting that it had been decided to concentrate on promotion rather than competition this year. It was agreed to use money from the government to create bilingual promotional banners, flag and board. Successful rally entries would be asked to present demonstrations at the

show.

The ER Phillips award would continue as noted above.

The report was adopted

(D) County Board of Management 15/06/16

Helen Hodges moved for the adoption of a written report highlighting the following points.

100+ Membership - she urged clubs, members and supporters to sign up to the county 100+ club and if possible sign up to direct debit payments on a yearly basis.

Helen noted that the Queens Ball would need a change of venue as the Parkhouse was not available. She noted that the cost would be increased considerably by using the Brithdir but that negotiations were ongoing.

Karen Jones, Michael Harries and Ros Bushel were nominated to be co-opted to board of management.

Helen moved for the adoption of the report.

Richard thanked Helen for her work as Board of management chairman for the last 6 years.

Nicola Owen offered her help and support in negotiating with the PAS

(E) Wales YFC Council 19/06/16

In moving for the adoption of a verbal report Richard Summons explained that the AGM due to be held in Tenby this year was causing issues due to unsuitable venues. He noted that the Wales AGM would be held on the 30th September -2nd October and information would follow although it may not be in Tenby.

Wales YFC has now been offered the opportunity to buy the whole building. Discussions are ongoing.

A space has become available for the European rally in July.

Membership is down 4.3% overall.

Levy discussions are ongoing with NFYFC and Wales are looking to make a formal agreement regarding return of 50% of the levy.

Wales YFC have been informed that S4C will not be filming the entertainment this year it was agreed that every county should write to S4C to express their disappointment.

The rules pack for the coming year are not finished yet due to staff shortage but will be sent out as soon as possible via dropbox.

Richard noted that Pembrokeshire were not the only county to send in letters following the public speaking and field day. A discussion had followed and a suggestion had been made to change the time allowed for each task in the EWS to 30 minutes at Wales's level. It was also noted that NFYFC were not planning to hold the competition in future. It was proposed that a morning and afternoon registration was needed. Chairman Vicky Hope had noted that it should be made clear to counties that complaints should wait until Monday morning as staff are not expected to deal with matters after a competition has ended. She also noted that counties had to take responsibility for signing in on time and turning up late for a competition is not acceptable.

There was a mistake in the football rules for the Wales Sports day and those who would be 27 years old would be allowed to compete.

The Wales Lamb rearing rules were set to change and anyone competing would need 3 lambs one of which will be killed to enter the carcass competition.

Expressions of interest for vice chair of committees to let Wales YFC know.

The report was adopted.

(F) Wales YFC Youth Forum

Eleri George gave a verbal report where she noted that the youth forum was prioritizing the 80th year at present.

The Wales YFC Youth Forum has been set the challenge to gather 80 messages of best wishes for Wales YFC's 80th anniversary. The format is a short film which can be taken on smartphones or tablets.

The committee have decided to turn down the proposal received from Aberystwyth University to take part in a weekend summer school on this occasion.

The committee agreed to use their booth at the Royal Welsh Show to draw attention to the Movement's 80th birthday celebration, and also offer milkshakes as a result of the continued support of Calon Wen.

The committee will hold their AGM during the same weekend as the main AGM as members enjoyed this opportunity last year and the numbers that attended the meeting last year also proved that it was a popular choice.

It was agreed to hold the meeting on the Saturday and Sunday when the weekend would include a visit, a meeting, social evening and a 'fun' day. We intend asking some of our experts to arrange the 'fun' day.

6. County Youth Forum report

Eleri George in moving for the adoption of a verbal report informed the meeting that the Youth Forum meeting had been held on Monday night at Mc Donalds due to a few members being unable to attend. Ideas for fundraising for next year had been discussed and a possible car wash. The forum is also keen to hold some more social events and continue with the junior ball. It was also decided to make use of the new equipment in county to film different events and activities and create promotional material for the county. The report was adopted.
